Spring Luncheon – May 3, 2014
Meeting Minutes

LuAnn Hadlock, President, welcomed everyone to the luncheon at The Egg and I and informed those present that the luncheon also constitutes an official meeting. Additional Board members present included Carol Sehnert – Vice President, and Karen Campbell – Secretary. Approximately 17 other members attended. All present introduced themselves and indicated how long they have been members of the SLGA. New members attending included Wendy Stewart, Abbe Stein, and Jean Labaree. LuAnn noted that we still need a Membership Director. This person will oversee the Social Committee, help welcome new members and have a vote on the Board.

Sign-up sheets for league play May 6 and for interest in a weekend trip out of town were circulated.

LuAnn reviewed changes to the Bylaws that were voted on last fall re: 1) Board member belonging to golf club, 2) Officer terms staggered. These changes are found in the revised Bylaws that were available at the meeting.

Carol Sehnert is working on the SLGA booklet. These will be available at the club after Memorial Day (in June). The Board has been discussing results and input from the fall member survey and how the feedback can be best addressed to align with our mission as stated:

“To promote fellowship and sportsmanship while encouraging friendly competition and active participation with all members. Our goal is to have fun while forming relationships with members who share a common interest in golf and adhere to the rules of the USGA”.

We have decided to establish weekly pairings randomly by drawing from a hat. This will promote interaction between members. Another concern related to 18 hole payouts. The 18 hole player with low net will receive a weekly prize, as will 1st, 2nd and 3rd place for the 9 hole competition each week. 18 hole players are eligible for the low net prize and the 9 hole game prizes. Margie Huron has been working on establishing the games and these will be listed in the booklet. Games will run June through August. In May and September there may be prizes for closest to the pin and longest drive.

Past-President and golf club member Margie Huron reported that the course is in great shape. They have purchased a new pump and are putting in new plantings to spruce things up. Seann Conway is the course pro and Tony Counts is the new assistant in the pro shop.

Sue Carpenter proposed a Hole in One Club. Play at all valley courses qualifies for this winning. It is \$5.00 to participate and the pot grows until someone wins, at that time everyone will re-up. There will be an envelope for this at the club.
